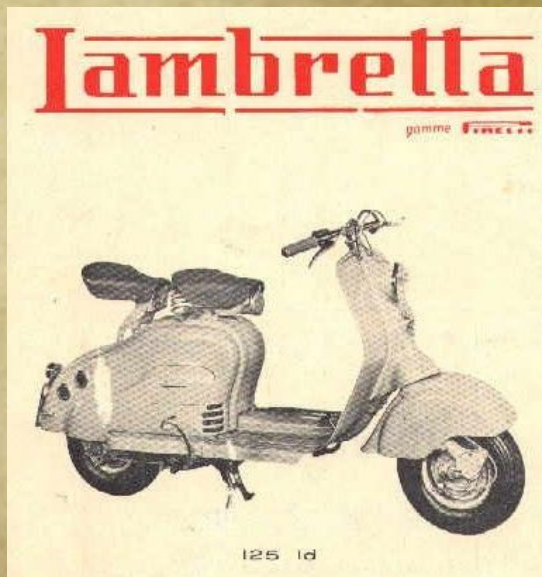

# The kinds of School mainly attended by Young People

After long negotiations, the Law No. 1859 of December 31, 1962 was approved.

It provides for the abolition of the Workplace Training School with the creation of a unified middle school that allows access to all high schools. In the same period, the mixed male and female classes in Italy are increased, which will progressively replace the classes composed exclusively of members of the same sex.



In those years, Latin was considered as very important as Italian and was essential for access to high school. While the study of any subject is required for access to technical and professional institutes.



# The Typical Professional and not professional jobs

Popular jobs in the 1960s were doctor, lawyer and pilot for men, and teacher, nurse and secretary for women. Race car driver, soldier, fashion model and stewardess were popular fantasy careers for young boys and girls. But in the 1960s there were other jobs too like salons, factory, delivery, broadcasting and teaching.





# The rights of the workers

## Rights

In 1964 an act was passed that said you could not discriminate a person because of their age, religion, race, ethnicity, nationality, color, sex or disabilities.

## Payment

Back in the 1960s the minimum was higher than it is today. about 9.22 to 10.52 an hour in todays money.

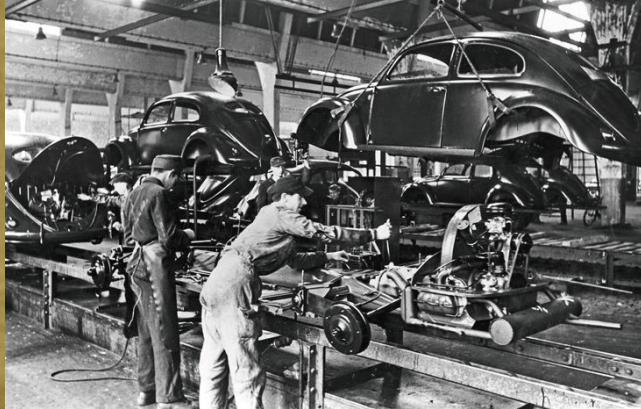
In the years when wages rose, working conditions worsened. Employers compensated for higher wages by negotiating higher levels of output. And leaders of trade unionism in the 1960s were all too willing to obey. Permits in the form of holidays, coffee breaks and sick leave all fell victim to the new labor standards of the 1950s and 1960s. Automation, forced overtime and accelerations allowed management to amply compensate with the high wages.



# The main Timetable of Workers

In these years, the main hours of workers are 8 hours of work and 1 break.

During the 1800s, people around the world worked extremely long hours, but during the 1900s working hours dropped dramatically, particularly in today's wealthier countries.





# The different job situation between **Men** and **Women**



In 1960, the women in the financial sector earn just 55% of men's wages. Some occupations have even "changed sex". In 1960, only 15% of accountants were women. Today there are more accountants than men. Likewise, the "cook" has gone from being a predominantly female job to one done primarily by men.



In the 60s men almost always had the jobs. According to tradition instead women usually stayed at home and took care of the house and the children, but the women began to work ...

# The different job situation between Men and Women

In this period there was an increasing trend for women to work outside the home; the number of women workers advanced from 29% of all women in 1950 to 34 % in 1960. Consistent with their growing importance in the labor force, women's representation rose from 27 % of all workers in 1950 to 32 % in 1960.
